## **FISH & GAME HAWKES BAY**

They're locals too. Fish & Game Hawke's Bay is one of 12 regional Fish & Game Councils across New Zealand. Their primary responsibility is the management of the game bird and freshwater fish habitats and populations across the Hawke's Bay region.

Fish & Game are working to create a beautiful outdoor space full of native plants, with three more ponds and much more wildlife. This redevelopment is supporting Fish & Game's work with Tamatea High School developing an environmental curriculum for all local schools and provides an even more beautiful place for the wider public to visit.

Jervoistown volunteers are helping with this beautification by potting up thousands of native seedlings, and planting many out on the Fish & Game grounds.
